Emerson staff. No need to join an internet wine club with their mystery wines and made up labels – Our case is infinitely more interesting and a better value! The discounted price for the NOVEMBER case-of-the-month is <u>\$119.99</u>; (average btl. price: \$10.00!!) the regular price would be \$167.99, a savings of more than 27%! THIS MONTH WE WILL OFFER AN ALL RED and an ALL WHITE CASE. The ALL RED case is 3 each of the 4 red wines for \$124.99 (same price as the mixed case!) or the ALL WHITE case which is 3 each of the 4 white wines for: \$124.99 or an all white case without the sparkling wine (4 each of 3 wines) for \$118.99!

Here is the line-up and as always, there are 2 each of the first four wines (\*) and 1 each of the last four wines. \*Chateau Le Prieur 2020 Blanc, Entre Deux Mer, Bordeaux, France - A blend of 80% Sauvignon, 20% Sémillon. Fresh and juicy with notes of under ripe Kiwi, lemon drops and white pepper. Balanced on the palate it finishes with crispy, salty acidity.

**\*Degani 2020 Valpolicella Classico, Veneto, Italy-** A blend of Corvina, Rondinella and Corvinone. Notes of cocoa dusted cherries with a hint of almond. Fresh, straightforward, velvety and with the right tannins to balance the acidity, It's best served slightly chilled.

\*Esporao 2020 Monte Velho Tinto, Alentejo, Portugal- A blend of Touriga Nacional, Aragonez, Syrah and Trincadeira. A vegan nose of tea rose petals and plum red pit fruits. Fresh and round with peppery notes finishing with an elegant harmony between the subtle and the lively acidity. *Plus when you buy a 12 bottle case it comes with a beautiful, free, made in Portugal scarf!* 

**\*Scacciadiavoli 2019 Grechetto, Montefalco, Umbria, Italy** - "Snappy acidity frames delicate notes of ripe green melon, Marcona almond, ground ginger and jasmine in this light-bodied white, with a salty mineral undertow. Drink now. 2,500 cases made, 500 cases imported." (WS Web only 2021)

**Comte de Laube N/V Blanc de Blanc Brut, France-** A blend of Chardonnay and Ugni Blanc using the charmat method. Fresh, dry and fruit driven with with hints of lemon and toasted almonds followed by floral and Marzipan notes. This is a fun alternative to Prosecco.

**Red Tail Ridge ''Good Karma'' Riesling, Seneca Lake, New York-** (100% Riesling) Notes of Mandarin orange, lime, pear and a touch of cucumber. Lush on the palate with lively acidity. It is a perfect turkey wine! (2.7% RS) Also *Red Tail Ridge will donate ten percent of the gross profit on every bottle to Virginia based Feedmore! In addition, as this is Peter Neff's favorite nonprofit (other than VFMA), we will also donate, in Peter's name, 10% of our gross profit on each bottle of Red Tail Ridge Karma to Feedmore!* 

**Freelander 2020 Pinot Noir, California** - Aged in French and American oak, it shows baked cherry and violet in the nose. Crisp flavors of red currant, baking spice and vivid strawberries balance the mouth feel. A touch of toasted oak completes the gentle finish. (Winery Notes)

**Chateau Bourdieu 2019 Rouge, Blaye, Cotes de Bordeaux, France-** "Flamboyant and deep, with ample, lush and fresh forest fruits, bramble and cassis, with cascading sweet spice swifty following. A super, brooding wine which will shine brighter with time" (Decanter 11/20)

Medium to full-bodied, ample and succulent, with supple tannins & an enveloping core of juicy fruit, it's refreshing & gourmand. This head-turning bistro red is already drinking well." As you shop in the store you may see some wines displaying a green price sticker. This is our way of letting you know that the wine is organic, biodynamic, sustainable or natural. This is an ongoing process as we research each and every wine in the shop. Verbiage on the bottle may tell you more or you may ask us for further clarification. We are organized by place, not attribute, but as the wine world has made a healthy move toward better farming practices we needed to find a quick way to identify organic, biodynamic, sustainable and natural wines.

#### **RETURN POLICY**

J. Emerson, Inc. guarantees that each bottle of wine we sell is in good condition. If you purchase a bad bottle of wine from us, please bring the bottle (with wine) back promptly. We will taste the wine with you to try and ascertain what has gone wrong and we will replace the bad bottle with a good bottle of the same wine. We are not responsible for any damage that occurs after the wine has left the store. This is especially true in the

summer. PLEASE do not leave your wine in your car or trunk. It takes less than two hours in 80-90 degree sun to "pop" a cork. We will NOT accept any returns of warm or hot bottles. Returns should come back to us at about the same temperature as our store.

#### OUR PROTOCAL FOR USING WINE REVIEWS

Throughout our newsletter you will find profiles of wine tastes and flavors written by professional wine reviewers. We use these reviews, when they align with our own tasting notes, because, frankly, these reviewers use descriptors and adjectives that are more interesting and often more on point than what we would write. When we use a reviewers notes we will always use quotes and we will always show attribution, i.e.: WA – Wine Advocate, WS- Wine Spectator, BH – Burghound and Vinous for...Vinous. Three of these review sources are reader subscription only and carry no advertising and they are: WA, Vinous and BH, and thus those are primary review sources. We will also occasionally use reviews from Decanter (the premier UK wine journal). Each review source also has reviewers that are better in some specialty then others. For example, Antonio Galoni has a wonderful sense of Italian wines and Allen Meadows of Burghound is a definitive source for the wines of Burgundy. The other key is that these reviews need to align with our tasting notes and if there is a huge discrepancy we will defer to our notes, which may be less interesting in terms of descriptors, but more in harmony with the wine profile. Our tasting notes would be any review without quotation marks.

#### **OUR WINE ENVIRONMENT**

If you shop here you already know that we take the condition of the wine environment in the store very seriously. Wines are on their side, we monitor humidity and the temperature on the main floor never rises about 63 degrees. (In the winter we strive for 60.) We use no fluorescent lighting in the wine areas – THE WORST POSSIBLE LIGHTING CONDITION due to the high UV content. Instead we have been using indirect incandescent lighting. Now we are in the process of converting our lighting to LED, a source that produces NO UV light rays! Does your wine retailer care enough to take these quality control steps? Ask questions next time you are in a big box retailer.
