Emerson staff. No need to join an internet wine club with their mystery wines and made up labels — Our case is infinitely more interesting and a better value! The discounted price for the NOVEMBER case-of-the-month is \$119.99; (average bottle price: \$10.00!!) the regular price would be \$168, a savings of over 28%!

Here is the line-up and as always, there are 2 each of the first four wines (*) and 1 each of the last four wines.

- *Quinta da Pacheca 2019 Branco, Douro, Portugal (made from Códega and Moscatel) a fresh and very aromatic wine with tropical fruits, citrus, white flowers and great minerality finishing with nice acidity. A great wine with all types of seafood.
- *Dal Maso NV Durello Brut, DOC Durello Lessini, Veneto, Italy- From the Veneto but it is not Prosecco! 100% Durello, hand-picked and made using the Charmat method with 2 months on the lees. Fresh with aromas of flowers and pears it finishes bright and dry with saline notes and bubbles.
- *Val de Salis 2019 Pinot Noir, Pays d'Oc, France An everyday Pinot Noir from the sunny Languedoc. Flavors of fresh cherry with hints of toasted spice and cumin, it finishes with mild tannins and appropriate Pinot acidity.
- *Lewis & Clark 2017 Proprietary Red, Columbia Valley, Washington State "Elegant and complex this 63% Syrah & 37% Cabernet Sauvignon blend shows aromas of ripe fruits, cherry, herbs and a hint of spice. It is very well-structured and finishes with refined, smooth tannins. Pair this wine with duck, braised beef, lamb and hard aged cheeses." Winery notes.

Klemens Weber 2018 Riesling Halbtrocken, Burrweiler Altenforst Pfalz, Germany - Full and smooth in the mouth with notes of ripe peaches, ripe pears and flowers with a touch of petrol in the background and juicy mouthwatering acidity. Halbtrocken means half dry so there is just a touch of sweetness which you will hardly notice as it is balanced by acidity. This is a friendly Thanksgiving suited wine and only 11.5% alcohol.

Renzo Masi 2016 Chiant Riserva, Tuscany, Italy – "A rich style, this red boasts black cherry, black currant, floral and subtle sweet oak aromas and flavors. Vibrant and balanced, with a tobacco note and dusty tannins gracing the finish. Sangiovese and Colorino. Drink now through 2024." (WS 10/15/20)

Chateau Haut Gaudin 2018 Rouge Superieur, Bordeaux, France – ripe and lightly spiced with black currents and plum aromas. This medium bodied wine has a plush mouth feel finishing with young Bordeaux tannins.

Domaine des Baumard 2019 Vin Blanc "La Caleche," Loire, France - (50% Chardonnay and 50% Chenin Blanc) Baumard is a renowned Loire Valley producer but in his region this blend of Chardonnay and Chenin Blanc results in a Vin de France classification. It is a wonderful combination with muted aromas of flowers, tree fruits and marzipan with flavors of citrus and crushed stone. The Chardonnay adds some weight in the palate and the finish is crisp and clean. A great Thanksgiving wine as an aperitif with oysters or with the bird itself.

SALE: 2018 Domaine Jaeger Defaix Les Cloux Rully Premier Cru, Burgundy France - "The 2016 Rully 1er Cru Les Cloux hails from massal selection vines between 45 and 60 years old. This is the brightest and most precise of Jaeger-Defaix's whites, offering up notes of lime, green orchard fruit, peach and white flowers. On the palate, it's medium-bodied & delicate, with attractive purity & a long, succulent finish." (WA)

This is a big but energetic wine with plenty of volume and concentration on the mid-palate that delivers excellent length on the seductively textured finale. This presently isn't as complex as the Embrazées but the underlying material appears to be such that more will almost certainly develop." (BH #63)

Picks up a spicy nuance with air, which sharpens the appealingly sweet black raspberry and boysenberry flavors. A bitter chocolate note appears on the long, penetrating finish, which is firmed by dusty, even tannins." (Vinus 10/19)

Earthy aromas with black cherries, raspberries and baking spices. Medium bodied, it finishes juicy with a touch of acid and tannins. It is a great food wine and has good Burgundy typicity.

Inky and voluptuous to the core, with soft curves and tremendous fruit intensity, the 2018 has it all. Crème de cassis, blueberry jam, spice, lavender, menthol and exotic white flowers build as this arrestingly beautiful showstopper opens up with a bit of air. Joel Peterson has done a tremendous job exalting the purity of the fruit, while avoiding the hard tannins that can at times make young Petite hard to approach. In a word...wow!" As you shop in the store you may see some wines displaying a green price sticker. This is our way of letting you know that the wine is organic, biodynamic, sustainable or natural. This is an ongoing process as we research each and every wine in the shop. Verbiage on the bottle may tell you more or you may ask us for further clarification. We are organized by place, not attribute, but as the wine world has made a healthy move toward better farming practices we needed to find a quick way to identify organic, biodynamic, sustainable and natural wines.

Consult with us on wines for your party or event and we will deliver directly to your home or office. Our regular deliveries will be made on Friday afternoons. There is no minimum order but there will be a delivery charge of \$10. Our regular service areas are zip codes 23226, 23229 and 23221

RETURN POLICY

J. Emerson, Inc. guarantees that each bottle of wine we sell is in good condition. If you purchase a bad bottle of wine from us, please bring the bottle (with wine) back promptly. We will taste the wine with you to try and ascertain what has gone wrong and we will replace the bad bottle with a good bottle of the same wine. We are not responsible for any damage that occurs after the wine has left the store. This is especially true in the summer. PLEASE do not leave your wine in your car or trunk. It takes less than two hours in 80-90 degree

sun to "pop" a cork. We will NOT accept any returns of warm or hot bottles. Returns should come back to us at about the same temperature as our store.

OUR PROTOCAL FOR USING WINE REVIEWS

Throughout our newsletter you will find profiles of wine tastes and flavors written by professional wine reviewers. We use these reviews, when they align with our own tasting notes, because, frankly, these reviewers use descriptors and adjectives that are more interesting and often more on point than what we would write. When we use a reviewers notes we will always use quotes and we will always show attribution, i.e.: WA – Wine Advocate, WS- Wine Spectator, BH – Burghound and Vinous for... Vinous. Three of these review sources are reader subscription only and carry no advertising and they are: WA, Vinous and BH, and thus those are primary review sources. We will also occasionally use reviews from Decanter (the premier UK wine journal). Each review source also has reviewers that are better in some specialty then others. For example, Antonio Galoni has a wonderful sense of Italian wines and Allen Meadows of Burghound is a definitive source for the wines of Burgundy. The other key is that these reviews need to align with our tasting notes and if there is a huge discrepancy we will defer to our notes, which may be less interesting in terms of descriptors, but more in harmony with the wine profile. Our tasting notes would be any review without quotation marks.

OUR WINE ENVIRONMENT

If you shop here you already know that we take the condition of the wine environment in the store very seriously. Wines are on their side, we monitor humidity and the temperature on the main floor never rises about 63 degrees. (In the winter we strive for 60.) We use no fluorescent lighting in the wine areas – THE WORST POSSIBLE LIGHTING CONDITION due to the high UV content. Instead we have been using indirect incandescent lighting. Now we are in the process of converting our lighting to LED, a source that produces NO UV light rays! Does your wine retailer care enough to take these quality control steps? Ask questions next time you are in a big box retailer.
